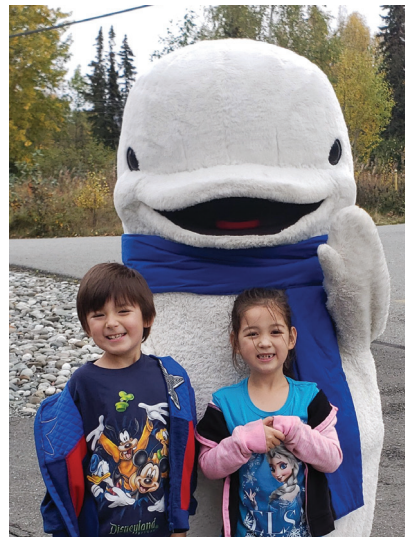

Carbon Offset Project

Tyonek Native Corporation, Finite Carbon and Steigerwaldt Land Services began the Forest Inventory process as required under our Carbon Offset Project. For approximately six weeks forest inventory crews, our own bear guards, and staff measured and inventoried trees in select locations throughout TNC lands around Tyonek and in the Kenai National Wildlife Refuge. TNC advises that residents and visitors to Tyonek not disturb trees in the designated zones where trees will be clearly marked as these inventory stands are necessary for TNC to monitor its forests to remain compliant with our Carbon Offset program. Trees outside these marked areas are still free to harvest for personal use. Questions or comments related to the Carbon Offset Project can be directed to TNC lands Department.





Tyonek Contractors, LLC

Tyonek Contractors has been busy in the Tyonek area with projects such as the Old Tyonek Creek Tributary culvert to replace a fish hinderance culvert, providing support for the plug & abandonment of Aurora's gas wells and facilities on Tyonek land, civil and equipment support to Eklutna Construction on the new Tyonek Clinic Housing project, building a new Harvest Shed for TTCD in the Community Garden, and TCLLC continues to maintain the Tyonek Village Landfill and as stevedor for all barges into the North Foreland Barge Landing. TCLLC subcontracted the Native Village of Tyonek to provide two Bear Guards for the Tyonek Carbon Project Inventory, and labor and equipment operators on various projects throughout the summer.

All of the above TCLLC projects and services were accomplished by a shareholder construction crew of a superintendent, three equipment operators, and five (5) laborers. All projects and services were completed in a timely, efficient, quality controlled and safe manner.

Alaska Glass and Door

Alaska Glass and Door (AG&D) has been involved with many construction projects over the past twelve months. AG&D has installed Aluminum-Framed Entrances and Storefronts, Windows, Translucent Panels, Curtain Wall, Glazed Assemblies, Glazing, Hollow Metal Doors & Frames, and Door Hardware for projects across the state. TNC Moves up 12 Spots in Top 49ers Listing

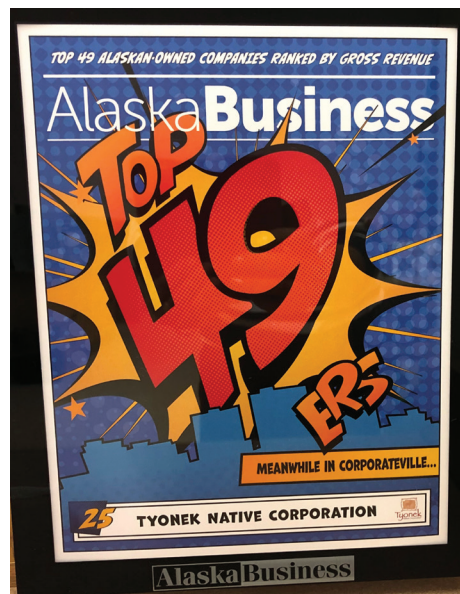

Shareholder picnics at Anchorage and Tyonek had great turnouts and plenty of fun. Anchorage had 92 shareholders while Tyonek had 79.



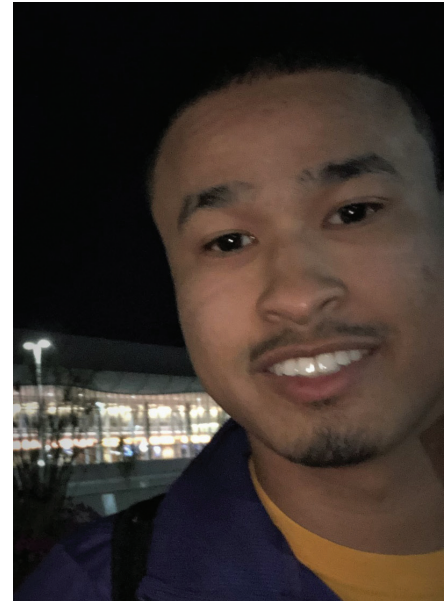
Shareholder Spotlight

AUGUST 2019 UPDATES

Tyonek Grown Program:

The Tyonek Garden is in full swing! TTCD staff added a new field at the Tyonek Garden this year to increase the overall capacity of the farm to produce vegetables. TTCD's Gwen Chickalusion and seven youth interns are growing and harvesting a large variety of fresh produce. Please check TTCD's Facebook page for more information on sales.



Habitat Monitoring & Restoration Program:

Fish Passage: The Chuitna Tributary culvert replacement is now complete, and the Old Tyonek Creek Tributary culvert replacement is underway. These projects will open 5 upstream miles and 20 lake acres to salmon.

Invasive Species Control: In June, TTCD worked with NVT and ADFG to remove more than 1,500 pike in Three mile and Chuitbuna Lakes. TTCD also worked with partners throughout the summer to implement control efforts on a 20 acre invasive plant infestation in Beluga to support healthy habitat. Lastly, TTCD continues to coordinate the Elodea Task Force for the District.

Technical Assistance Program:

TTCD staff worked with the NVT environmental department to help coordinate the backhaul of 90 lbs of e-waste from Tyonek in July.

Tyonek Youth Conservation Science Program (TYCS):

Through a generous grant from the US Department of Education, TTCD and partners are developing new conservation science curriculum that TTCD staff will use in the upcoming school year at the Tebughna School. 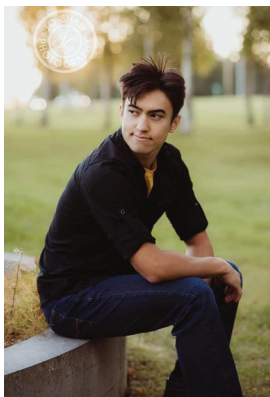

MISSING BENEFICIARY FORMS

A TNC Shareholder who owns Shares, or is a lineal descendant of a TNC Shareholder, is entitled to a benefit that pays for various funeral expenses of the TNC Shareholder. After funeral expenses have been paid, a lump sum payment for remaining funds is mailed to the heir listed on the Shareholder Beneficiary Form. It is very important for this form to be completed and submitted to TNC, otherwise the State of Alaska law guides the distribution of remaining funds.
