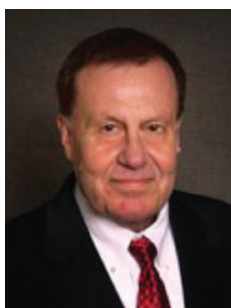

## FROM THE CEO...

Dear Shareholders of Tyonek Native Corporation;

It is very exciting to report, as we approach fall time here in Alaska following a very busy summer, that your Corporation is beginning to return to financial health. After 20 months of hard work to stabilize the Company our current financials show black ink that are projected to continue through year end. We have been very fortunate that our business development efforts have resulted in filling our government defense services pipeline with over \$600 million in multiyear contract work that will sustain us in the years ahead. In addition renewed oil and gas development work is beginning to occur near our home village of Tyonek providing potential work opportunities there for residents and others as new pipelines are being built and work to assess oil development activities on lands to the South of Tyonek is slated to begin next year. TNC recently signed off on an oil pipeline right of way agreement that resulted in a \$1.75 million dollar payment that the company received in mid-August. This payment goes directly to TNC's bottom line which will benefit the company overall and will contribute to a positive year end earnings forecast which, if sustained, will allow your Board of Directors to consider a year end distribution which the company had to forego in recent years because of our economic health.

All of these positive trends for TNC and its shareholders have been the result of the hard work and commitment of the over 800 employees your Corporation has working in its many operations. We now do business in 14 of the United States and our portfolio continues to grow as we pursue new opportunities in defense contracting and begin to look at new investment horizons to diversify our business base.

This month is an exciting time for your Company as your Board and Management Team hold our annual Strategic Planning Meeting in Tyonek to further chart the course of TNC's future. We have successfully accomplished the initiative targeted from our last strategy session-- that being to return the company to profitability. Now our focus must turn to sustaining our renewed growth while expanding our business reach to enable greater earnings and benefits to our Shareholders. A great testimony to our climb back to profitability was a recent participation of 4 Tebughna youth in the Naval Air Academy program in Pensacola, Florida. With financial support from the Blackhawk Foundation, whose mission is to increase the exposure of youth to careers in science, technology, engineering and math, we were able to foster a beginning that we intend to continue exposing our younger shareholders to the type of work our companies engage in hopes of encouraging them to pursue the proper course of studies to work at and one day lead our operations.

Although the chillier days of fall approach there is no lack of energy and effort at TNC these days; far more challenging and exciting times lie ahead for TNC and its shareholders who have been very patient and supportive as we had to work our way back to fiscal stability for our people. 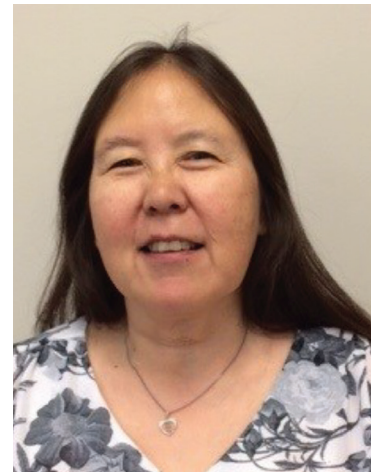
You've probably already noticed the new format of our newsletter. We hope this more professional layout will make it easier for you to find information.

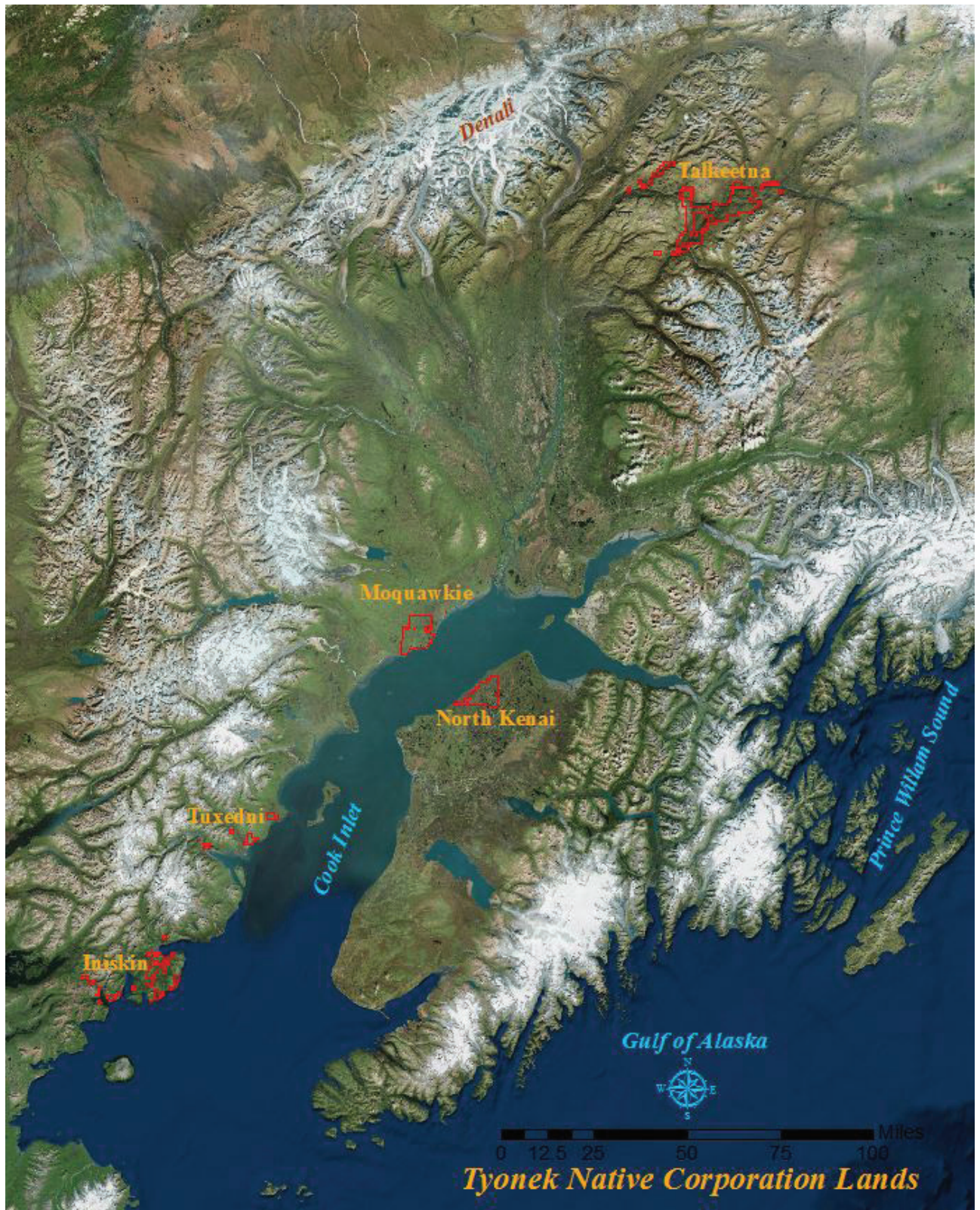

# LANDS NATURAL RESOURCES

Tyonek Native Corporation owns approximately 193,000 acres in the Cook Inlet and South Central Alaska area. The majority of the lands are distributed throughout five different regions. Upper Susitna, Moquawkie, Kenai

Peninsula, Tuxedni Bay, and Iniskin Bay.

In 2014 the Tyonek Native Corporation (TNC) developed a Forest Stewardship Plan (FSP) that was implemented to guide forest management for at least ten years. It will assist managers



in making sound decisions for the Tyonek Forest Lands. This has guided the corporate management team recently to implement practices to secure long term sustained yields from the lands and forests. Items indicated as opportunities in the FSP include Carbon Sequestration, Conservation, Environmental Quality Incentive Programs, Commercial Tree Thinning to enhancing wildlife habitat, not including moose predator reduction, but equally important. Many other contingencies exist and will arise in the future, which will assist with the long term sustained yield of best forest practices.

As passive and active management methods move forward to make the best stewardship efforts and practices over time, a number of different agreements have been entered into or will be entered into in the future, while maintaining a private community at the village of Tyonek. TNC has agreements with a wide variety of groups and businesses, worldwide.

Donlin Gold and TNC have entered into an Option Agreement, which is a step toward creating a conservation easement, protecting 4085 acres on the Chuitna River Watershed. This conservation easement of no development on the river meander area and the wetlands to the northwest on the Moquawkie Property will be in place for 99 years, in a restricted deed with the Army Corps of Engineers, to allow for customary and traditional practices to continue, as well as generating revenue from hunting and fishing tourism.

Hilcorp, an Oil and Gas Development Corporation, has entered into an agreement related to a Oil Pipeline Right-of-Way ROW adjacent to the current Gas Pipeline (known as the Moquawkie gas line) across Tyonek land. British Petroleum (BP) and TNC are negotiating an agreement to develop a Carbon Credit Offset Area on the Moquawkie and North Kenai Properties. The area will consist of over 35,000 acres of forest land owned by TNC that will be used for the next 100 year to generate revenue by creating clean air which will offset a portion of the carbon dioxide emissions created by BP annually worldwide. TNC is working in coordination with another company, Finite Carbon, who will be doing the inventory and analysis of the forest on our properties to establish a baseline value and an amount of clean air that is emitted annually

Top Gun Treks a Big Game Guide business located in Wasilla, AK who offers a wide variety of guided outdoor attractions, hunting and fishing South Central Alaska. Their main focus is black and brown bear hunting along with fishing in the Moquawkie area. While Top Gun Treks clients are hunting or fishing they will be renting rooms at the lodge during their stay and paying access fees.

Ursus Alaska is a fly out fishing guide business offering fishing trips throughout the Cook Inlet Alaska area. Ursus will be bringing day trip clients to fish the Chuitna River during the summer to target Coho Salmon. While Ursus Alaska clients are fishing they will be paying access fees.

Kaiser-Francis, an Oil Development Company, has created a subsidiary - Plugging Inlet (PI), which will be performing all the Plugging & Abandoning of the Aurora Wells that have gone into bankruptcy on the Moquawkie Property.

TNC has agreements in place to work with Tyonek Tribal Conservation District TTCD to utilize the Moquawkie property to develop agriculture programs, enhance and expand fish habitat by replacing culverts in the road systems, and planting browse foods for moose. This development work is being completed in and around the village, while community members grow vegetables and increase salmon habitat.

Active management leads to development of the resources in trade for income. Passive management generates revenue by conserving the resources. In order to accomplish best practices with a fiduciary economical approach, entering into agreements that will allow for a balance of both types of management to create revenue are the focus. Conducting management with this balance over the lands, while generating the most revenue, creates an environment that will allow for a long term sustained yield of the natural resources, which in turn maintains customary and traditional practices in a private setting.



# TCLLC

**Tyonek Contractors, LLC (TCLLC)** has been involved with several construction projects over the past twelve (12) months:

We were the successful bidder for the Tyonek Tribal Conservation District (TTCD) and Alaska Department of Natural Resources designed and funded New Congahbuna Lake Outlet Culvert Replacement Project. Work was substantially completed on 27 July 2018 and included installation of a bypass road and stream diversion channel, installation of a 16' wide aluminum plate culvert and a 7' diameter corrugated metal overflow culvert, and stream "toewood" banks restoration.

TCLLC and the Native Village of Tyonek (NVT) executed a Master Services Agreement (MSA) for issuing Task Orders (TOs) to NVT for TCLLC acquired construction projects. NVT installed the above mentioned Congahbuna project bypass road under the first issued TO. TCLLC will offer NVT participation in future projects under the MSA.

TCLLC also bid TTCD's Lower Indian Creek Fish Passage Project. However Western Construction and Equipment (WC&E) was the successful bidder. WC&E and TCLLC provided significant shared resources and services in supporting each other in accomplishing the simultaneously constructed projects, particularly with barge and materials transportation services. WC&E hired two shareholder laborers for accomplishing their work.

TCLLC accomplished several oil and gas pipeline projects support services with the following companies (particularly providing Tyonek Landing barge beach preparation, trailers and equipment off-loading/loading and distribution to GPTF, Kaloa and BP Junction):

- Hilcorp/Harvest - Provided equipment movements and

road plowing and repairs

- ASRC Energy/Houston - Completed subcontract for clearing pipeline right-of-way
- Merkes Builders - Provided gravel and equipment movements
- Amaroq Resources - Hauled fuel and water

Three (3) Bear Guards were provided to Finite Carbon for the Beluga Lake area to protect survey scientists and foresters in their evaluation of the area.

All of the above TCLLC projects and services were accomplished by shareholder construction superintendent, equipment operators, mechanic, and five (5) laborers. All projects and services were completed in a timely, efficient, quality controlled and safe manner.

TCLLC arranged for free transportation to Tyonek over each of the past two summers for over a dozen vehicles, materials and Tyonek Housing supplies on contractor paid barges from Anchorage, Nikiski and Point Mackenzie landings.

TCLLC continues looking for contracting opportunities.

## Subsistence is Our Agriculture.

### AUGUST 2018 UPDATES

**Habitat Monitoring & Restoration Program:** This summer, TTCD implemented the following projects to support healthy fish and wildlife:

- **Fish Passage:** Culvert replacements on lower Indian Creek and at the Congahbuna Lake outlet are now complete. These projects have opened up 8.8 miles of upstream habitat and 419 lake acres for salmon.
- **Invasive Plant Control:** Continued herbicide control of 15-20 acres in Beluga to support healthy habitat, and began to survey lakes for elodea, an invasive aquatic plant.
- **Invasive Pike Control:** Worked with Native Village of Tyonek, Alaska Department of Fish & Game, and Cook Inlet Aquaculture on a month long pike control effort on Threemile Creek system in June, leading to the removal of 1,300 pike.

**Tyonek Grown Program:** With the growing season at its peak, the Tyonek Garden is now producing a bountiful variety of delicious vegetables and fruits.

This summer, veggies are available for purchase in Tyonek

and Anchorage. Tyonek sales take place in two places: on Wednesday afternoons at the Garden and daily at the Tyonek Tribal Center. Anchorage sales take place through the Anchorage Food Hub. Check the TTCD Facebook page for more info.

**Technical Assistance Program:** TTCD and the NVT Environmental Department are continuing to work together to complete waste removal and backhauls this summer. If you are a Tyonek resident with electronic waste or lead batteries that you would like to get recycled, please drop off electronic waste at the Old Snack Shop and lead batteries next to the Fire Department near the stack of batteries. If you have questions, please contact the NVT Environmental Department at 907-583-2201.

## TYONEK SUBSIDIARY AWARDED \$21M CONTRACT SUPPORTING FLEET READINESS CENTER SOUTHEAST

Tyonek Global Services, LLC (TGS), a subsidiary of Tyonek Services Group, Inc (TSG), and Tyonek Native Corporation (TNC), has been awarded a \$21M contract to support the Fleet Readiness Center Southeast (FRCSE). The contract will employ 340 (+) skilled artisans and provide support for aircraft, aircraft engines and associated components and materials undergoing Depot Level Maintenance (DLM). This will include the moderation, conversion, in service repairs, disassembly and all other areas of DLM.

## NEW CONTRACT AWARD SUPPORTING COAST GUARD IN KODIAK, ALASKA

Tyonek has received an 8(a) directed award in support of Department of Homeland Security's, US Coast Guard (USCG). The award, a three (3) year IDIQ contract is for the procurement of HC-130J aircraft spares. The contract has an annual ceiling value of \$9,995,000.00 in which the USCG will issue Delivery Orders throughout the 3-year period of performance.

The Tyonek procured spares will primarily support the sustainment of fifteen (15) Minotaur Mission System Operator (MSO) equipped HC-130J aircraft, five of which will be stationed in Kodiak Alaska.

The company continues to build a strong relationship with the Coast Guard as this contract is in addition to a 3-year IDIQ contract, currently valued at \$17.2M dollars that we received in May 2018 to manufacture HC144/C27 Minotaur MSO Pods and A Kits.

## TYONEK AWARDED \$9.8M AIR FORCE SPACE COMMAND CONTRACT

Tyonek Global Services, LLC, a subsidiary of Tyonek Services Group, Inc. (TSG) and Tyonek Native Corporation (TNC), has been awarded a contract by the Air Force Space Command to continue to provide formal cyber operations training, course development, and essential capabilities for the 39th Information Operations Squadron (39 IOS). The 39 IOS is the U.S. Air Force's premier information operations and cyber operations training unit, providing Cyber Weapon Systems Initial Qualification Training (IQT) for Air Force Space Command, Air Forces Cyber and US Cyber Command.
